Our lead Governor for Child Protection is Hinal Patel.

They have been a huge success and a fantastic opportunity for parents and carers to see what our curriculum looks like. ### Lost Property and Lunch Boxes

### Premises Issues

I would like to thank all parents and carers for the patience afforded regarding the gate at the Duke's Avenue Entrance to the site. The fallen tree came from one of the houses of Dukes Avenue and the delay in replacing it has been due to communicating with Haringey Local Authority, the Insurers and the gate manufacturers. As the regulations have changed since the previous gate was installed, it has taken time to get the appropriate fit to match the fence panelling. There was a second delay in installation so that the colour would match the existing panels. Graham and I have impressed upon the manufacturers the urgency to have this entrance secured. We have been given another deadline date of 28.2.14 for final installation.

You will have noticed that the willow tree in the Key Stage 1 playground has been removed. The reason for this is that it had 'fallen' due to the soft soil by approximately 4 inches. There was a danger that if it was not removed it could have fallen in mild winds.

The Ark, which was decommissioned and has been out of action for some time has also been removed by Haringey Local Authority. This part of the school premises had been cordoned off as the site was deemed unsafe. Our school Governors and I are very much looking forward to launching a survey to determine what will be put in the place of The Ark.

### School Improvement Planning 2014

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If you are reading a paper version of this Newsletter, I attach a business card that shows a brief description of our school improvement priorities for 2014. If you are reading an e-version, there are plenty of business cards available in the school office that show what the school is focusing on this year. We will also send one home via the children.
