I am really looking forward to working with you and your children throughout the coming year.


Welcome to Y1 and Y2 children, parents and carers. I hope you all enjoyed the summer.

How we've been spending money from the Learning Enhancement Fund



Thank you so much for your donations to Muswell Hill's learning enhancement fund.

- 1. We have designed and made new subject books for all the children from Year 1 to Year 6 to record all their amazing learning. Each book includes our marking codes and prompts for children and adults. This will help them feel a sense of pride and care with their learning materials, improve their presentation and record their creative outcomes. We will be exploring further home reading and homework records as we progress through the year.
- 2. We have already made collaborative links with the Unicorn Theatre in Southwark and we have 200 places to take children there. However, we would love to take all 420 children to the theatre this year so will be looking at additional ways to help fund these wonderful creative learning opportunities.
- 3. Our final learning project involves an online homework package that will support the practice and embedding of key skills required for Literacy and Numeracy. Each child will receive a personal log in. We will discuss this more with you when you come to the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings this week and at the 'Meet the Leaders' sessions with me over September.
